

 Watch <u>the video</u> to listen to The Day the Crayons Quit by Drew Daywalt.




 Complete the activity sheet to get students thinking more the problems and solutions presented in the book. While working on the activity sheet have students think about the discussion questions below.

- How could the situation in this story be applied in real life?


