Carboard Tube Jellyfish

What you need:

- Cardboard tube (from toilet roll/kitchen roll)
 - Scissors
 - Paint
 - Paintbrush
 - Cotton buds
 - String
1. Paint the outside of the cardboard tube one colour.
 2. Paint the inside of the cardboard tube a different colour. Allow to dry.
 3. Using a small paintbrush, cotton buds, or markers, add designs to the top of the cardboard tube. This will be the bell of the jellyfish. For inspiration, you could look at different types of real-life jellyfish. You will see that they come in all colours, patterns, and sizes!
 4. Cut long slits from the bottom of the tube up to the patterned top part of the tube. Repeat the whole way around the tube.
 5. Using a pencil, roll the jellyfish tentacles up so that you can reveal the colour underneath.
 6. Cut a small hole in the top of the jellyfish and place a string through it so you can hang it up.



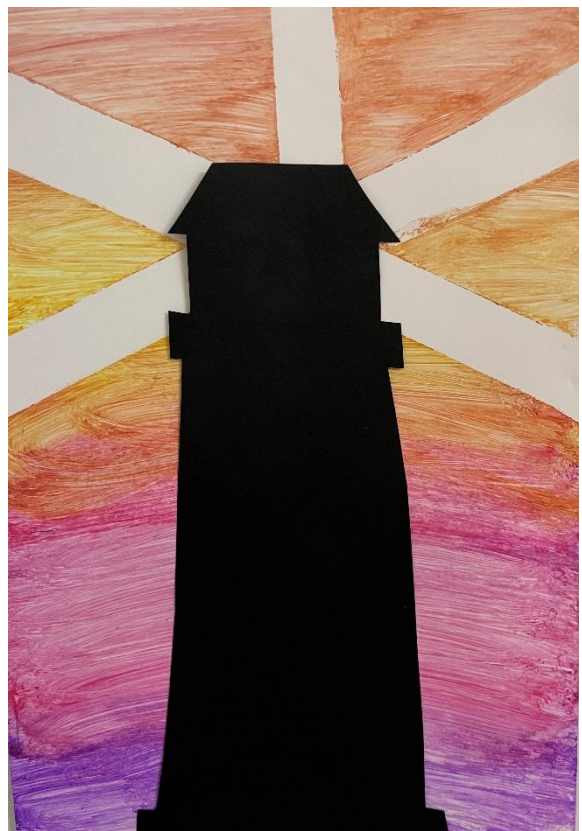
1st-2nd Class

Lighthouse Silhouette Art

What you need:

- Card
- Paint
- Black paper
- Lighthouse Printed template (See Appendix 1)
- Masking tape
- Glue stick

1. Print the lighthouse template and use it to cut out a lighthouse on black card.
2. Lay the lighthouse on a piece of card. Stick strips of masking tape from the light of the lighthouse to the outside of the card so they look like rays of light.
3. Remove the black card lighthouse but keep the masking tape in place.
4. Paint the paper creating a vista of the sky. You could create a daytime blue sky or an evening orange sky. Be as creative as you like!
5. Allow the paint to dry.
6. Once the paint is dry, remove the masking tape.
7. Using glue, stick down your lighthouse template



3rd -4th Class

Salt Paint Fish

What you need:

- Card
- Glue
- Paint
- Paintbrushes
- Table salt

1. Using the glue, create an outline of a fish on the card.
2. Next, add details like eyes, mouth, gills and scales.
3. Pour the salt over your fish so that all of the glue is covered.
4. Shake the excess salt off.
5. Dip your paintbrush into your watercolours (or food dye mixed in water) and then gently dip onto the salt. The more liquid the paint, the better. Watch as the colour travels through the salt lines.
6. Set aside for a day or two to dry.

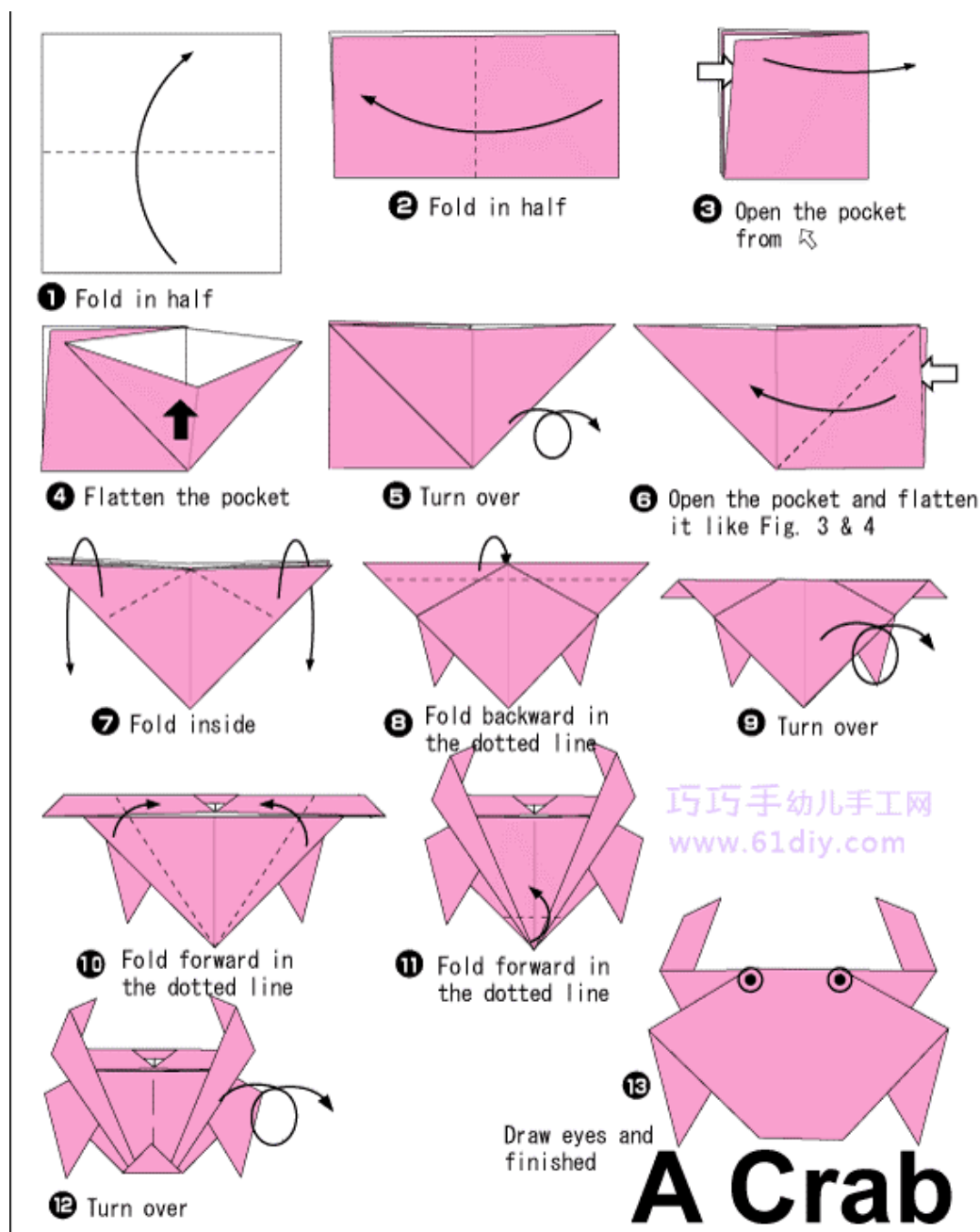
Origami Sea Creatures
