- Bicycles became the most important mode of transport for Cubans during the early 1990s when the island nation suffered a massive economic collapse (called the 'Special Period' by Fidel Castro).
- China donated about a million bikes to Cuba as a way to ease the difficulties created by the lack of transportation and fuel embargo.
- After a decade, Cubans' love affair with the bicycle ended with many considering it a symbol of the failure of the political system and a reminder of the hardest years of the Special Period.
- Recently Cuba has seen a resurgence in cycling and bicycle tourism.




## Bicycles in parts
