Dolphins are marine <u>mammals</u>. This means that they are <u>warm</u> blooded, feed their babies with <u>milk</u>, and give birth to live young. A baby dolphin is called a <u>calf</u>.

Dolphins have <u>lungs</u> and need to come to the surface to breathe. They breathe through nostrils on the back of their head, which is called a <u>blow-hole</u>. Dolphins often jump out of the water too, this is called <u>breaching</u>

Dolphins live in groups called <u>pods</u>. They are very <u>intelligent</u> and communicate with each other by making clicks and <u>whistles</u>. Dolphins have a special sense called <u>echo-location</u>. This works like the sonar of a submarine, and helps them to find their <u>prey</u>: fish and squid.
