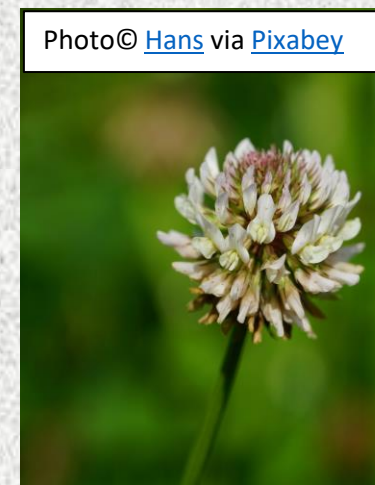
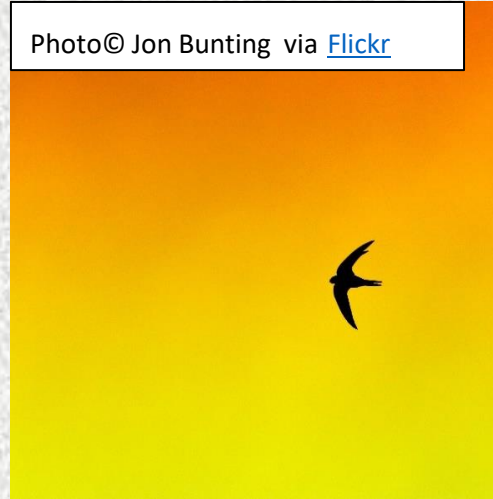


May - Nature Spotter Sheet



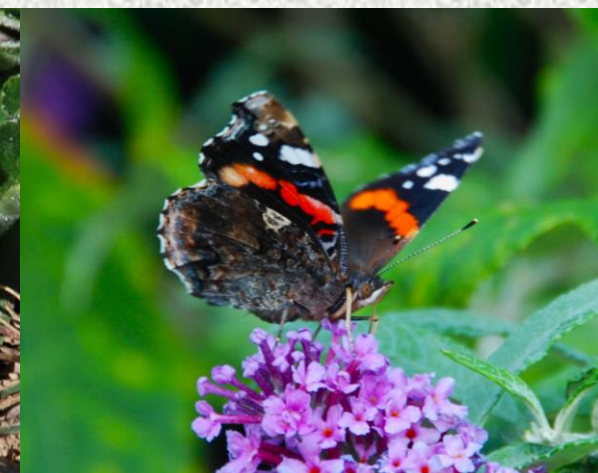
Elder trees are starting to bloom. You can collect these flowers to make a delicious elderflower cordial!
