

# Wipe Toilet Experiment

If you use wipes you need to put them in the bin afterwards. Flushing them down the toilet can cause blockages in your home and in the wastewater network. They can also do considerable damage in the environment. The below experiment shows why it is ok to flush toilet paper down the toilet but not wipes.

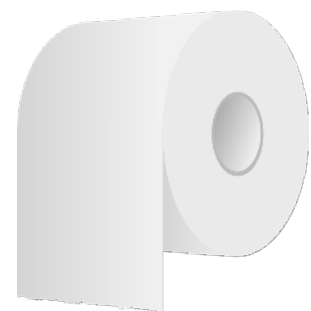

**Set up time:** 10 minutes

**Wait time:** 3 minutes

**What do you need?**

1. 2 x jars with lids
2. 5 x Wet wipes, facial wipes or baby wipes \*
3. 20 x Toilet paper sheets \*



\* Doesn't have to be accurate measurements



## What you need to do?

1. Put water in the two jars
2. Put toilet paper in one jar and wipes in the others
3. Make sure the lids are on tightly
4. Shake the jars
5. Observe what happens



## Questions

1. Did the toilet paper breakdown? Did the wipes breakdown?
2. Which do you think clog up pipes?
3. What do you think happens when wipes from a lot of toilets go into waste-water treatment plants?
