Global Goals Book Club and Global Goal 1: No Poverty

Teaching children about Global Goal 1: Zero Poverty is crucial because it promotes empathy, awareness, and a sense of responsibility. "Those Shoes" by Maribeth Boelts beautifully aligns with this goal by illustrating the struggles and sacrifices faced by those living in poverty. Through the story of a young boy who yearns for a pair of popular shoes that his family cannot afford, children learn the value of compassion, sharing, and understanding the difference between needs and wants. By discussing the themes of the book, students gain insights into the realities of poverty and are encouraged to think about how they can contribute to a more equitable world. This connection helps children grasp the importance of helping others and working towards a society where everyone has access to basic necessities.

Read or listen to the book 'Those Shoes' by Maribeth Boelts with your class. The questions below offer a guide for discussion with your class, along with some actions and activities to complete.




Discussion Questions:

- 1. What do you know about poverty?
- 2. How does Jeremy feel when he sees the other kids wearing the "cool" shoes?
- 3. Why do you think Jeremy's grandma says they can't afford the shoes?
- 4. How does Jeremy react when his shoes fall apart?
- 5. Why does Jeremy choose to buy the shoes even though they don't fit him?
- 6. What do you think about Jeremy's decision to give the shoes to Antonio?
- 7. How does Antonio feel when he receives the shoes from Jeremy?
- 8. What did Jeremy learn about the importance of material things versus relationships?
- 9. How can small acts of kindness make a difference in someone's life, especially those living in poverty?
- 10. What are some ways you can help people in your community who might be living in poverty?
- 11. Why is it important to think about others and their needs, not just our own desires?
- 12. How does poverty affect children differently from adults?
- 13. Can you think of a time when you wanted something but couldn't have it? How did you feel?
- 14. How can we make sure that everyone has the things they need, like shoes, food, and a place to live?

Hint: Make sure to follow the directions on each page to create your needs vs wants shoe flap!
















Attach the needs and wants in the spaces below, then move on to page 3.

There was lots of new and exciting words in our story. Learn the meanings of those words by matching the word to the definition below.



There was lots of new and exciting words in our story. Learn the meanings of those words by matching the word to the definition below.






Sequencing Activity Sheet

Think about the story and what happened at the beginning, middle, and end. Draw a picture of each stage below.


Hint: look back at the story to refresh your memory!





Story Mapping Activity Sheet


Think about the characters we met in the story and where it took place, then draw the characters and setting below.
