Read or listen to the book 'Little People, Big Dreams: David Attenborough' by Maria Isabel Sánchez Vegara with your class. The questions below offer a guide for discussion with your class, along with some actions and activities to complete.



Discussion Questions:

- 1. Who is David Attenborough?
- 2. Why do you think he became interested in nature and animals?
- 3. What are some of the most interesting things David Attenborough discovered about our planet?
- 4. How do these discoveries help us understand the importance of taking care of the Earth?
- 5. David Attenborough travelled to many places around the world. Why do you think it is important to explore different parts of the world to learn about climate and the environment?
- 6. What changes have you noticed in the environment or climate in your own surroundings?
- 7. How do these changes make you feel about the future of our planet?
- 8. David Attenborough has talked about the dangers of climate change. What do you think climate change means?
- 9. Why is it important for us to learn about it?
- 10. What are some actions David Attenborough suggests we take to protect the environment? Which of these actions can you do in your own life?
- 11. In the book, David Attenborough shares stories about wildlife and nature. Why is it important to protect animals and their habitats?
- 12. How do you think pollution affects the environment and climate?
- 13. Can you think of ways to reduce pollution in your community?
- 14. David Attenborough often speaks about the beauty of our natural world. Why do you think it is important to appreciate and protect this beauty?
- 15. What are some things you and your family can do to help fight climate change?
- 16. How can small actions make a big difference?
- 17. Why is it important for young people like you to learn about climate action?

More Questions for Discussion:


- 1. How can you share what you learn with others?
