Lesson Plans and Activities



The main objective for Walk to School Week is to hold a WOW Day but we also have a range of walking related fun activities and lesson plans which will raise awareness of the benefits and joy of walking! Please share this pick 'n' mix sheet with teachers.

Investigate & Create



Explore your local area with the '<u>Investigate and Create</u>' challenge. This challenge invites students to investigate what they hear, see and feel on the way to school and create a visual representation of how they experienced their locality. This is an ideal activity for all ages to celebrate National Walk to School Week.



Walking Debate

Agree to disagree in this <u>active debate</u>. Students are encouraged to express individual viewpoints on a statement about walking, share experiences that may influence others to change their standpoint (literally), and listen actively and speak confidently about their choice.



Create the Ultimate Walking Playlist

What songs inspire you when walking? Do you like happy hits, or electrifying beats which help to pick up the pace? Or something with a more relaxed tempo? Discuss with your class what are their favourite walking tracks. Pick the best 10 and submit your <u>walking playlist</u>.



Catwalk Relay Race

This hilarious on-yard activity is guaranteed to generate lots of fun while getting students to think about the joy of walking! This <u>relay</u> <u>race</u> comes with a twist and is sure to be enjoyed by all!



Traffic Light Game

This is another fun on-yard game. Imagine what it's like to be a car! How would you move if you were going round a roundabout? Or going over a speed bump? How could you turn into a bus? Or a plane? Explore the world of movement and transport with your body in the Traffic Light Game.

Signposts for my locality

Design a school gate leaflet to remind your school community of the safe driver and pedestrian behaviour needed outside of school. This document can also be a useful tool for your school in the planning and promoting of a Park & Stride location.

- Get creative and hold a <u>Bling Your Shoes</u> competition for walk to school week. Make sure to encourage the use of recycled materials and take care to use old shoes.
- Draw yourself walking to school throughout the different seasons.
- Learn to tie shoelaces in a creative way with Green-Schools <u>Tie My</u> <u>Shoe-Laces</u> (Junior Primary) or <u>Shoe-Lace Master</u> (Senior Primary).
